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THE BEST AND WORST OF 2022

"Traveling helped me broaden my worldview. I meet new people, learn about different cultures, and explore various aspects of each destination."

ast year was my busiest year in terms of travelling. With 35 flights and over 1,000 miles of rail travel completed, I figured I should summarise my 2022.

My first trip of the year allowed me to visit t my final UK nation, Wales and it's capital Cardiff. Flying with easyJet to Bristol before taking GWR to Cardiff, then back to London.

March involved two different trips. The first was a day to London, travelling with British Airways to London Heathrow for the first time. I decided with this trip not to create a plan before travelling, and decided instead deciding to see what I wanted to do at the time.

My second trip in March allowed me to visit my first new European country since before the pandemic hit. A five night trip to Paris booked with easyJet holidays allowed me to see one of Europe's most popular cities and most famous landmarks (I still don't see the hype about Paris, although I have learned this may not be a popular opinion).

My biggest trip of the year kicked off on April 1st 2022 at the Marriott Courtyard at Glasgow Airport.

On April 2nd I made my way to Glasgow Airport to fly with Lufthansa in Business Class to New York via Frankfurt on an Airbus A320 and Boeing 747 on the upper deck.

After spending the night in Manhattan I took my first ride with Amtrak to the wonderful city of Philadelphia. Spending the day walking around the city, in the rain made me feel like I was back in Glasgow. From there it was another Amtrak ride further south to Washington D.C.

The following morning involved a trip back to Newark Airport before taking my first United Airlines flight in 11 years to Chicago, where I would take the Empire Builder Train across the North of the USA to Seattle.

After spending the night in Seattle and travelling down to Portland I flew United Airlines to Denver, before flying to Phoenix with Southwest Airlines the following morning.

Another new airline, Frontier had the pleasure of flying me back to New York, before Lufthansa took me back to Glasgow, this time in economy where I belong.



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After a short break at home it was time to travel again, this time with Ryanair from Glasgow to Brussels Charleroi. This would be my first time in Belgium and only my second time flying Ryanair from Glasgow Airport.

After spending the day in the city of Bruges I made my way back to Brussels for the night. I decided to fly with Brussels Airlines to Prague and spend some time with family and friends before flying with Ryanair into Edinburgh.

I would be back in Glasgow Airport soon enough, this time flying with Jet2.com to the Italian capital, Rome. Visiting Rome allowed me to visit another new country, Vatican City before taking the train across to Bologna.

From Bologna another train took us to Rimini, before boarding a coach to San Marino, possibly Europe's most peaceful country.

We then flew back to Glasgow from Bologna with easyJet via London Gatwick.

July was host to another trip, this time with Ryanair and TAP to Lisbon, make sure you read my TAP review to see why I am not keen to recommend them to you.

After a night in the Portuguese capital Lauda took us to Vienna before Ceske Drahy took us to Prague. I spent the rest of July in Prague before flying with easyJet back to Edinburgh.

September started off as a busy month, flying with Aer Lingus Regional from Glasgow to Belfast City. After spending the day exploring Belfast I made my way back to Glasgow. My aim was to fly with Flybe on one of their Q400 aircraft, however, this was changed to a Greek airline called Marathon and one of their Embraer 175 aircraft.

A few days later I travelled with LNER to London from Edinburgh, another review you do not want to miss. After a disappointing trip I flew back to Glasgow with British Airways CityFlyer from London

I then resisted the urge to travel until November when I flew with British Airways CityFlyer to London City in order to attend the WorldTravelMarket 2022 at the ExCel. Here I had the opportunity to interview travel brands, learn more about places I plan on visiting, connect with other travel writers and gain insider knowledge on the industry from some of the most influential figures within travel.

This is something I want to do more of, and hope to attend the event this year and also have a few more events I would like to attend if I have the opportunity to do so.

The final month of the year kicked off with a last minute trip to Prague, flying with Ryanair to and from Edinburgh.

Despite numerous visits to Prague before, this would be my first time visiting in winter, and allowed me to experience the cities world famous Christmas Markets, I would definitely recommend visiting them if that is your sort of thing.



SUMMER ESCAPES

Where will be popular this summer, and where you should go to escape the holiday rush.

This summer is gearing up to be even busier than last year. With that in mind I have decided to share with you where I think you will find the best deals and where to avoid the rush.

This is just my opinion, based on my experiences. With that in mind her are my thoughts.

Bulgaria

Bulgaria was just voted as the best "Value for Money" destination by the Post Office. As a result airlines across the UK are increasing capacity to Black Sea destinations in the country.

Although flights operate to Burgas, you will find package deals to Sunny Beach & Nessebar. If beach holidays are not your thing, flights are readily available to Sofia for those travellers who prefer a city break.

Portugal

Portugal is one of Europe's cheapest countries, and getting their from the UK has never been easier.

With new easyJet flights from Glasgow to both Porto and Lisbon it has never been easier to escape to the sun for a weekend city break.

Flights are also available to both Funchal and Faro for those looking for a relaxing break in the sun a bit further from home,

Malaga

With people looking to save money, but still escape to the sun I expect Spain to remain popular with tourists.

I have selected Malaga for this list as I am seeing flights to Malaga selling well, and expect this trend to continue as summer approaches.

Offering a city break in the sun, as well as the opportunity to relax on the beach all in the one place. Multiple daily flights are available.

Poland

Poland is likely to remain a popular place for tourists this summer. Krakow offers visitors the opportunity to visit one of Poland's oldest cities, including the medieval city centre, and the cities famous Jewish Quarter. Although people go on holidays to relax, you cannot visit Krakow without taking the day to visit Auschwitz and learn about Poland's dark past.

Unlike Krakow, the capital Warsaw is defined and known for it's historic looks and vibrant energy. This is a city that never sleeps and is easily accessible to those on a budget.

For those who enjoy both modern and old architecture, Warsaw should be high on your list of places to visit, and even during summer the city will still feel relaxed and welcoming.

Wroclaw was built in the 13th-century, and was largely destroyed by bombs during World War 2. Despite this, the city is second on the list of "Polish cities everyone wants to visit" and is known for cheap beers and small local pubs.

Toronto

Toronto is the only long haul destination on this list.

Known for being the gateway for Niagara Falls, the city is also home to the CN tower, High Park, Lake Ontario and one of the longest urban waterfronts in the world.

Plus, it's location within Canada makes it an ideal layover point for those travelling to other Canadian cities, including Calgary, Kelowna or Vancouver.

With daily flights this summer, and flights available throughout the year Toronto is easily accessible at any time of year.

Iceland

My next trip of the year begins with an overnight stay in Reykjavik.

Toronto

Having changed the itinerary for my trip to Canada I now only have two nights in Toronto.

I currently plan on visiting Niagara Falls, and using the rest of my time to explore the city and what it has to offer those visiting. If I have time I also plan to go to the top of the CN Tower and get the best view of the city available.

Calgary

After Toronto I will be flying with one of Canada's newest Low Cost Airlines, Flair, on their Boeing 737 Max 8 to Calgary.





I have booked to stay in Calgary for 6 nights, and will use this time to explore one of Canada's lesser know cities to UK travellers.

Due to the nature of booking this trip I will be staying in two different hotel and also aim to publish a guide to the city, so look out for them this summer.

Kelowna

This has been somewhere I have wanted to visit for a long time, and now I have it booked.

I have a day trip from Calgary booked, and will be flying their with Lynx Air, also on their Boeing 737 Max 8.

After visiting I will publish a short post about why I wanted to visit, and if it was worth it.

Burgas

I mentioned in the previous version of this magazine that I was considering visiting Bulgaria.

I have now confirmed the dates and cities I will be arriving and departing from.

I will be arriving into the city of Burgas, having flown with British Airways and Ryanair from Glasgow via London.

whilst here I will be shown around the city by a friend and getting an in-depth guide to the city and how it is different from the UK.

I have not decided on content from this trip, so stay tuned as I will confirm this closer to departure.

Sofia

The Bulgarian capital will be my departure point for returning home, this time with Ryanair from Edinburgh at the unfriendly time of 0545.

Due to time constraints I will only have a very limited time in Sofia, so if I find myself enjoying Bulgaria then I will plan another trip and will make sure to visit Sofia again.
