## **Key Statistics About Chinese Tourists**

- 5th Largest international inbound market to Scotland by visitors
- 1% of overseas tourists to Scotland are Chinese
- Chinese tourists contribute 1% of overseas tourism spending
- Significantly less visitor numbers in 2023 when compared to pre-covid levels
- Trips are longer than they were pre-covid

### **2017 DIRECT CHINA ROUTES**

#### **Edinburgh Airport**

There were no direct services between Edinburgh and China.

#### **Glasgow Airport**

There were no direct services between Edinburgh and China.

### **2017 PASSENGER NUMBERS**

There were no direct flights between Scotland and China in 2017, as a result passengers arrived via another port of entry outside Scotland.

### **2023 DIRECT CHINESE ROUTES**

#### **Edinburgh Airport**

**Beijing**: Served 2x week by 303 seat Hainan

Airlines Airbus A330-300.

#### **Glasgow Airport**

There were no direct flights between Glasgow and China.



### **2023 SUMMARY**

- Hainan Airlines operated the only direct flight between Edinburgh and China.
- All flights between Scotland and China were operated by Chinese based airlines.
- Edinburgh Airport was the only airport to have flights to China.
- Peak summer witnessed 2 weekly flights.

# 2017/2023 COMPARISON - NOTES

- Hainan Airlines operate a 2x weekly flight between Beijing and Edinburgh
- Unlike when the route launched in 2018, this flight is now direct and does not operate via Dublin.

### **LOOKING AT 2024**

- Hainan Airlines extended the run time of their season between Edinburgh and Beijing.
- Flights in peak summer were increased from 2x week to 4x week.
- There were still no flights between Glasgow and China.
